## CLUB NEWS

**With Antenna season starting soon, here are some tips on tower climbing and work:**

This is going to many hams, most if not all will agree and do not need this lesson. Many could write the book, but perhaps they will help spread the word. Enough is enough! An article will appear shortly in leading magazine making the points. It says clearly if you want a tower and antennas then pay the piper up front, follow some good safe rules of an antenna party and have fun. Spread this word to any media.

I think I'm old enough to say this and pardon the one-way military talk, but responsible men and women who may be hams will understand and get on board. If it offends anyone, so be it.

One of my Elmer's W3GRF (SK) did this with me years ago and it was a good lesson, he meant well and I took it that way. Here is my lesson for those wanting to install a towers/antennas.

I'd suggest before anyone purchases a tower/antenna they acquire the following:

- 1/2" nylon rope double the height of the tower + 25' for a ginpole, which can be borrowed.
- 3/8" rope the same length for moving things up and down the tower.
- 1/4 or 5/16 x 200' of utility line.
- two 1/2" pulleys to use with either the 1/2" or 3/8" nylon rope.
- two shackles to tie the pulleys one to the top and one to the bottom.
- set of deep well sockets/ratchet, a 3/8 drive is good enough.
- screw drivers, open ends, pliers, dikes, soldering iron/gun, etc.
- hard hat (!).
- GOOD safe belt. It must fit.
- several roles of black tape and plastic ties.
- Never run out on a job, never!

This is about minimum anyone who wishes help from their buddies should have. It's called an antenna party, a fellowship, happy times together helping each other. Fun. The host provides drinks at a minimum and generally serves or purchases lunches or at least offers.

The host always should remember the climbers are in charge, period. They call the shots if for no other reason, safety. The host should insist all ground crew wear hard hats either having some spare hats or as any good antenna/tower ham knows, have one at ready and with them when they arrive.

Let the climber set the pace and when they have had enough, it's time to eat, drink or go home.

If you are the host and the tower isn't safe, make it safe or don't ask anyone to climb something you wouldn't climb yourself. They have families that depend on them to pay the cell bill.

As said, buy these things as part of being responsible and worthy of being a host for the antenna party. THIS is before one buys a tower/antenna.

### K1AR CONTESTING HINT

Avoid the temptation of diving directly into a pileup after first hearing the frenzy. Take the time, especially when using a smaller station, to listen to the operating style of a needed multiplier before calling. Adding a planned delay of two or three QSOs to learn the DX STATION'S techniques will usually reduce the time needed to get him into YOUR log.
